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Health and Hygiene Week: Pre-Primary

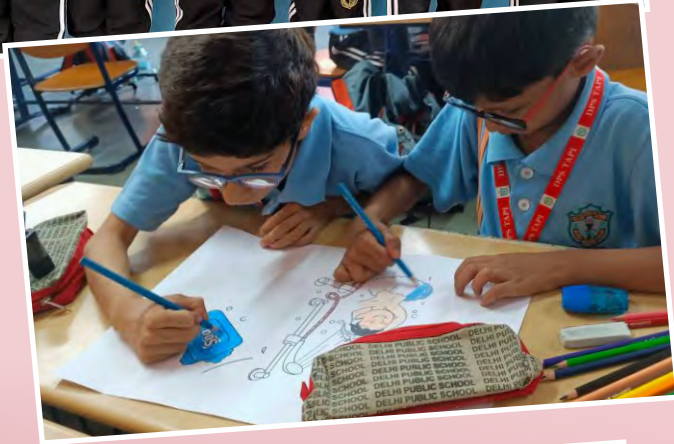

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Mother's Day Celebration (I-II)

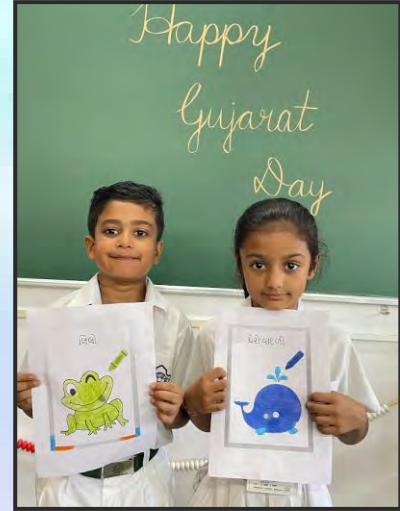

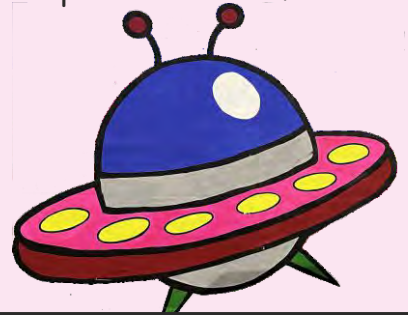
Story Narration Assembly

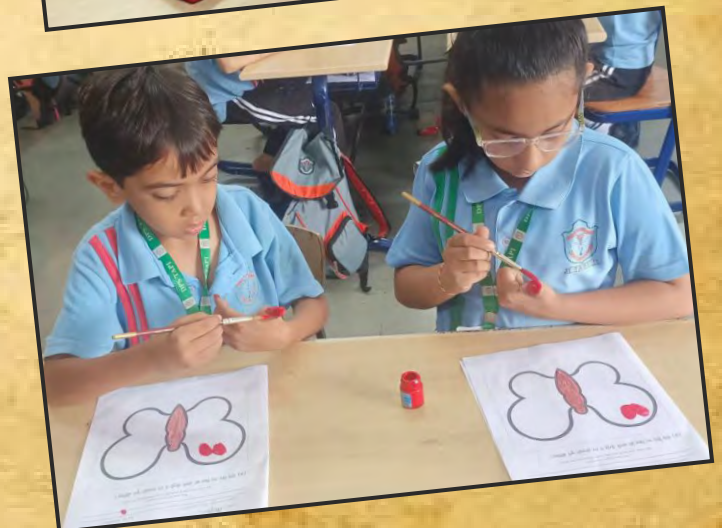
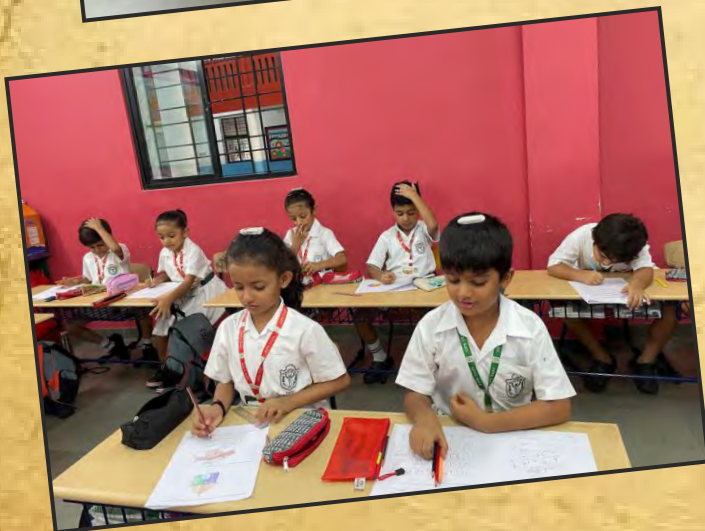


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English Handwriting Week

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Fruitaastic Fun: Pre-Primary Fruit Creativity Extravaganza

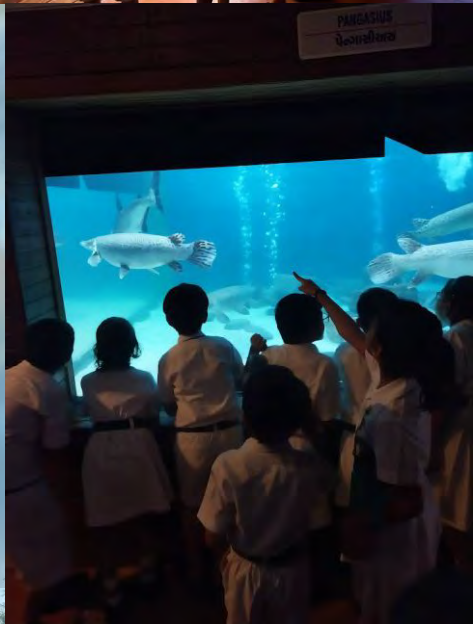

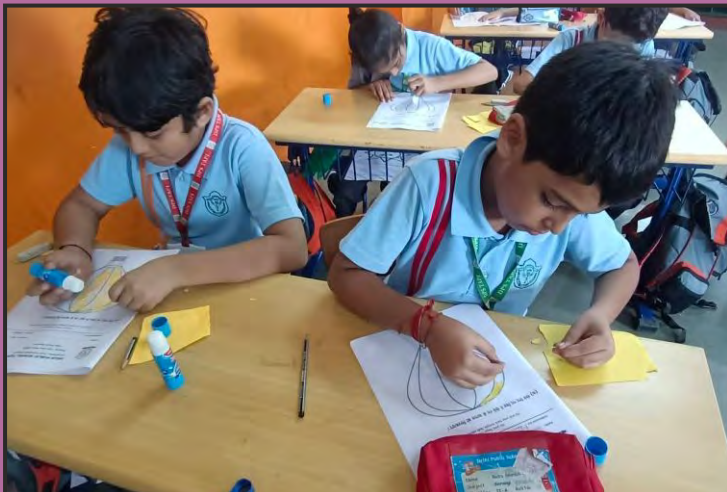
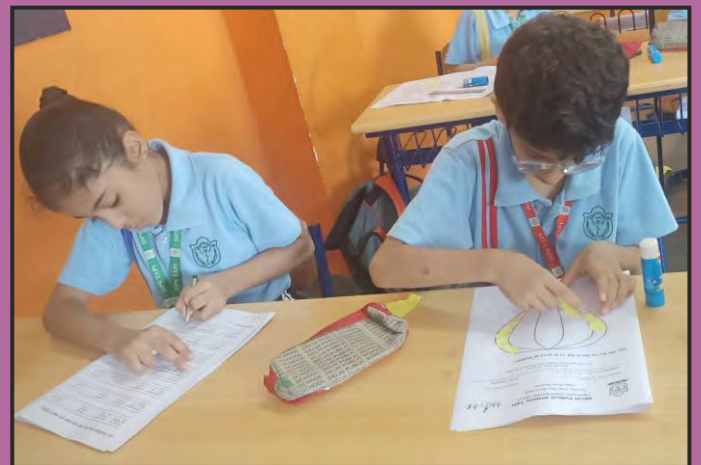
